

#### FACT

As of 04/30/2022 PHSSCA tested 3,609 inmates for HIV, Syphilis and Hepatitis C; 6 positive for HIV, 40 positive for syphilis and 22 positive for Hepatitis C

In 2020, there were 2,799 inmates screened in Guilford County Jails; 2 HIV positive, 31 Syphilis, 56 positive for Hepatitis C
