# SE AETC Continues for Another Five Years

- Southeast AETC out of Vanderbilt University Medical Center was recently awarded as the Central Office for the Southeast Region
- This HRSA funded grant will run from July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025
- AETC purpose: to increase the number of health care providers who are effectively educated and motivated to counsel, diagnose, treat, and medically manage people with HIV.

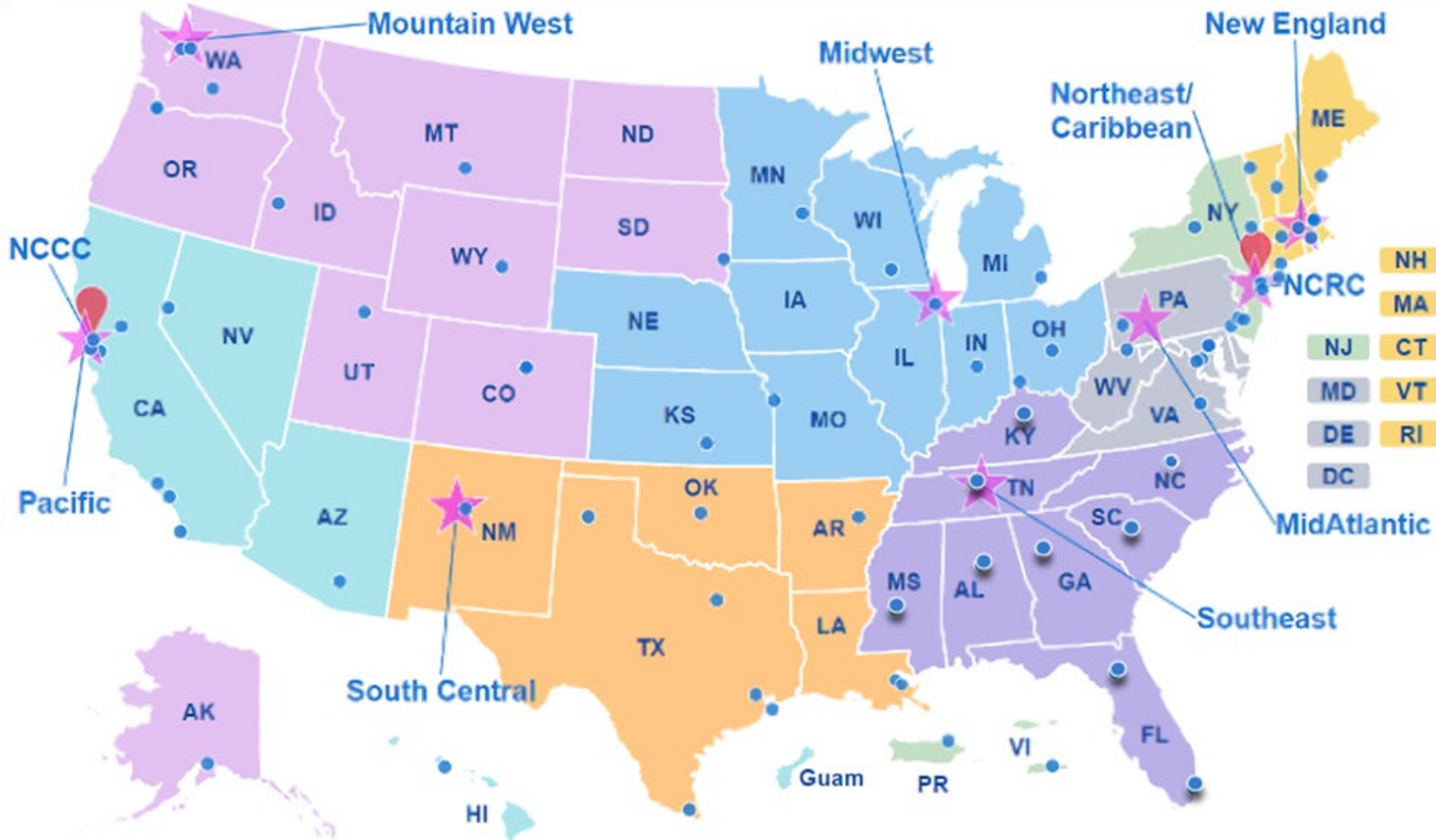


## When was the Ryan White Care Act created?

The Ryan White CARE Act was created in 1990 to help states, communities and families cope with the growing impact of the HIV/AIDS epidemic at that time.

## Four Overarching AETC Program Goals

- Goal 2: Expand the ability of health care team members to provide effective HIV care and prevention services.
- Goal 3: Improve health equity by integrating HIV care and prevention in primary care and other health care settings that provide services to underserved populations.
- Goal 4: Enhance the capacity of the RWHAP AETC Program to train health care team members to serve people at risk for or with HIV.

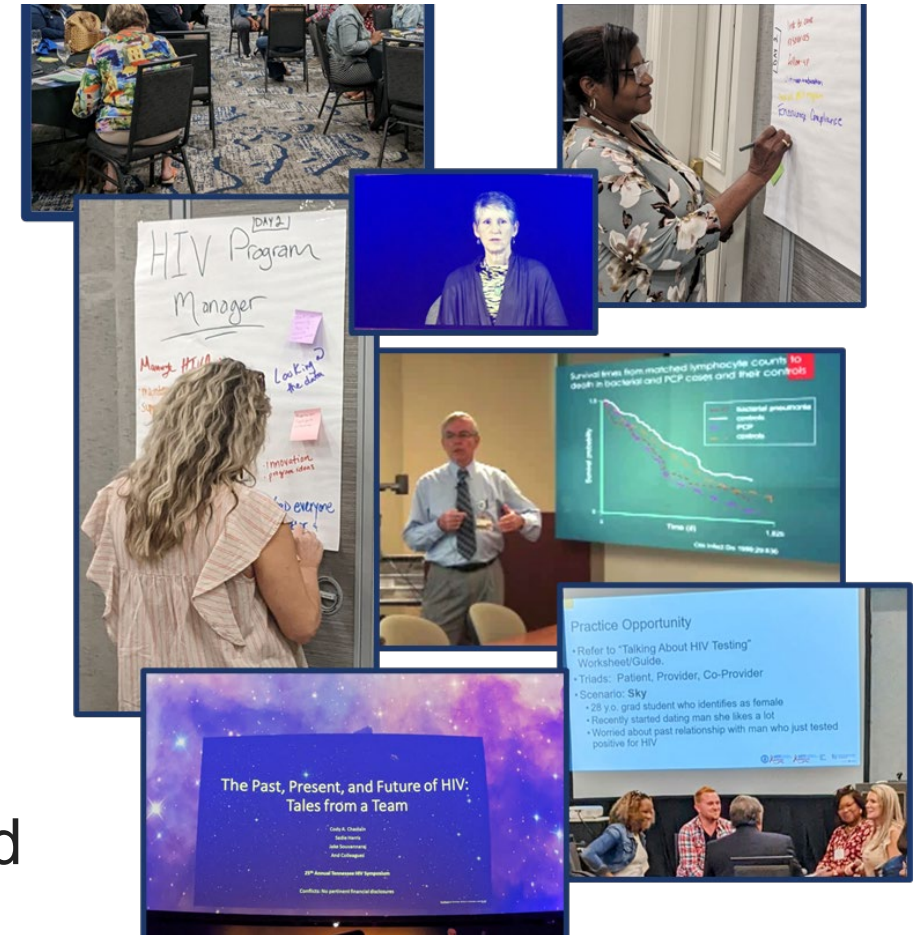

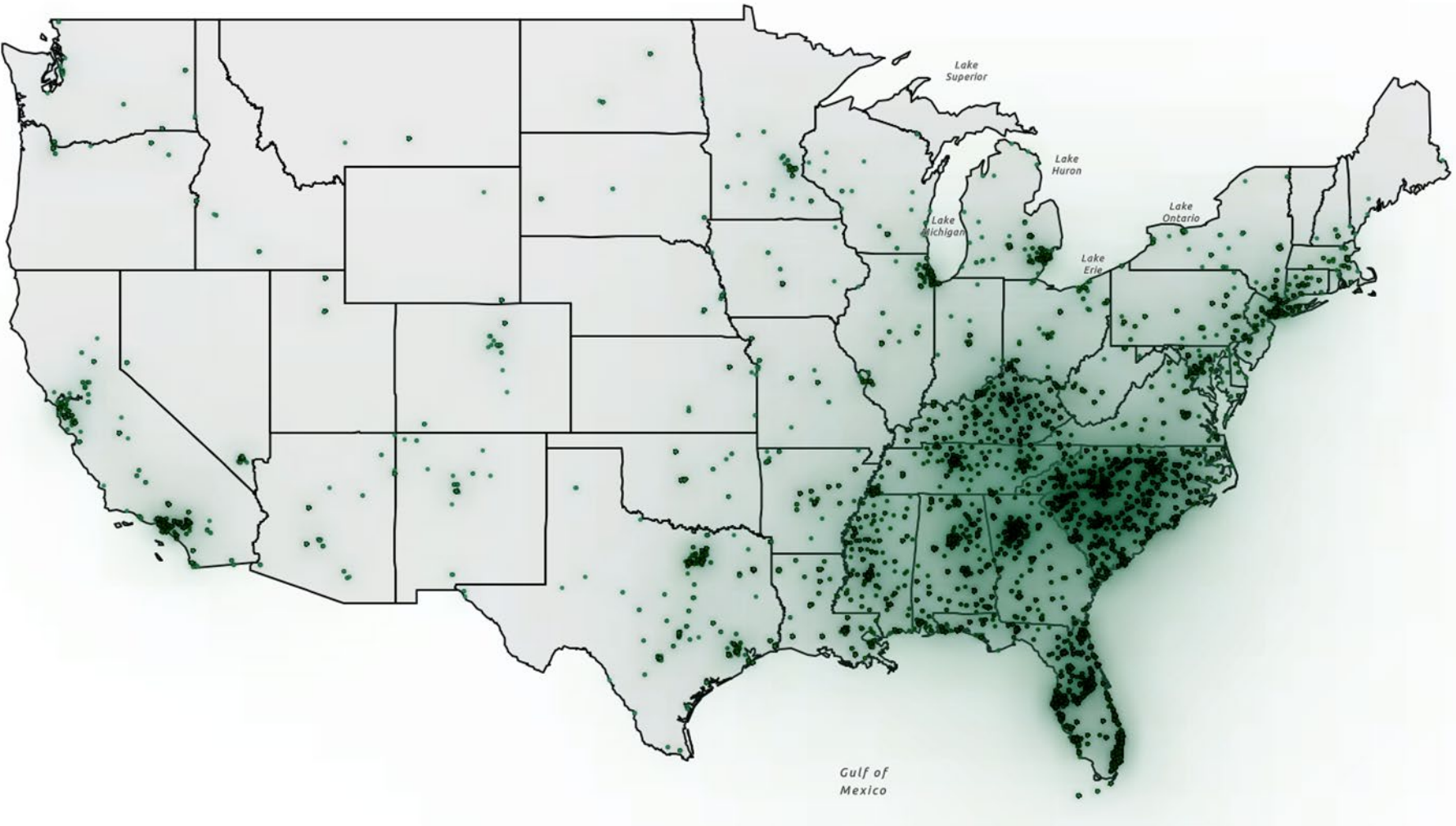

# Foundations of HIV (FH)



Educate and train health care team members currently not involved in HIV care



Increase the ability of novice providers to prevent and diagnose new HIV infections



Identify PWH who are undiagnosed or out of care, and link patients not on antiretroviral therapy to care



Foundational topics include HIV Testing, PrEP Prescribing, uncomplicated HIV Care and common comorbidities

# Capability and Expertise Expansion (CEE)



Train experienced HIV providers



Increase ability of health care team members currently involved in HIV care to offer quality services



Offer interactive education based on current national treatment guidelines



Improve skills to offer comprehensive care to PWH



Delve deeper into HIV treatment challenges and complicated co-morbidities



## Interprofessional Education (IPE)



Increase the number of medical, nursing, pharmacy, physician assistant, behavioral health and other students who intend to practice as a team member in the field of HIV



Semester or year-long interactive clinical and classroom experience



Focused on the four IPEC Core Competencies: Values/Ethics; Roles/Responsibilities; Communication; Teams/Teamwork

# Practice Transformation (PT)



Build capacity to provide HIV care and prevention at the clinic level



Longitudinal program to train all clinic providers and staff from the front desk through to the clinician



Progress through multiple levels of PT from HIV testing and linkage to ART and PrEP prescribing to care of HIV with comorbidities



Yearly goals developed by clinic champions and a regional AETC coach



Provide onsite and virtual training, skill building workshops, protocol development and quality improvement project assistance

# Practice Transformation – Does your clinic qualify?

**Criteria 1:** Clinic must be a Ryan White funded site or an FQHC.

**Criteria 2:** Clinic must have an EMR

**Criteria 3:** Clinic must meet one of the items below:

- Located in an EHE-funded jurisdiction OR
- Patient population served is at least 25% racial/ethnic minority OR
- Patient population served is at least 10% LGBTQIA+ OR
- At least 10% of patient population experiencing substance misuse

# Practice Transformation – Does your clinic qualify?

**Criteria 4 - FQHC:** Must Fall below one of the following Uniform Data System (UDS) performance measures:

- **HIV Testing:** Percentage of patients age 15 through 65 years tested for HIV - **below 94.67%** OR
- **Linkage to Care:** Percentage of patients seen for follow-up treatment within 30 days of diagnosis **below 43.81%**

**Criteria 4 – Ryan White Funded Clinic:** Must Fall below one of the following performance measures reported on the RWHAP Service Report (RSR)

- **Annual Retention in Care:** Percentage of patients, with HIV who had at least two (2) encounters within the 12-month measurement year (**below 78.3%**) OR
- **HIV Viral Load Suppression:** Percentage of patients, with HIV with a HIV viral load less than 200 copies/ml at last viral load test (**below 89.7%**)



# Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI)

Three projects focused on equipping BIPOC health care providers to offer HIV care services in their practices and increase access to care and prevention



Interprofessional Education at MSIs of higher education;



PT at tribal and indigenous serving health care facilities to incorporate HIV prevention, care and treatment into their practices;



HIV Curriculum Integration at MSIs to incorporate HIV topics into programs focused on training and educating minority-serving health professional students.

# Ending the HIV Epidemic

SE AETC enacting a three-pronged approach to ending the HIV Epidemic in jurisdictions identified at risk for an HIV outbreak

**End HIV Academy**  
Skill building for the prescriber new to HIV care

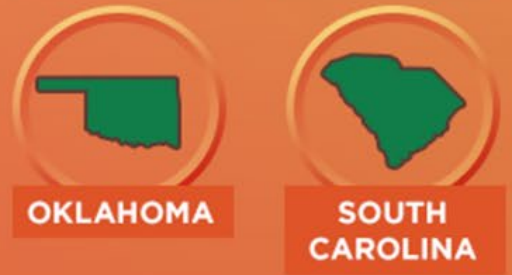
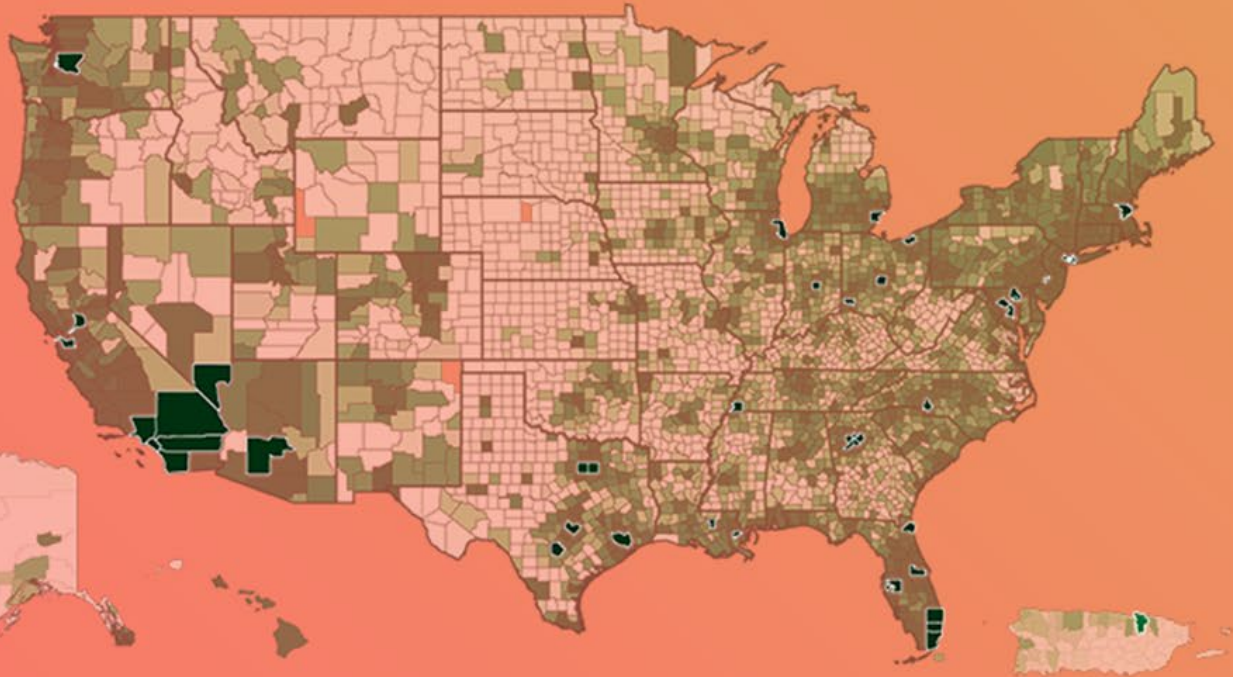
**Clinical Support and Training (CST)**  
Individualized coaching for jurisdictional clinics to increase HIV care and prevention services

**Response Toolkit**  
A collection of resources and training recommendations for providers on the ground identifying and responding to an outbreak.



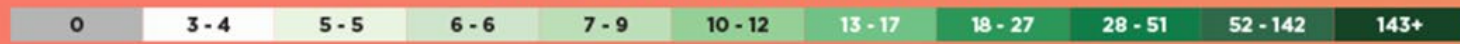
# Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America

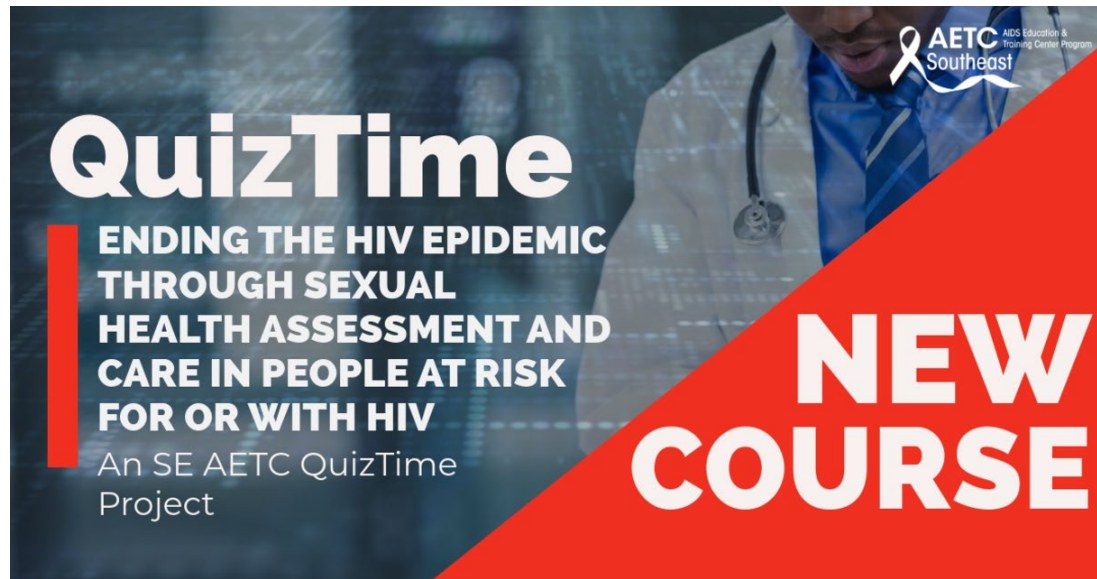


# IMPART
